Praise Report on Africa Prays 1st Anniversary

Brother Mathurin Lokpo, an Ivorien bass guitarist, then led us in powerful Worship with songs in French and English. The program was an alternating medley of Praise and Worship sessions and words of exhortation and motivation by various Pastors and speakers.

Pastor Patricia Johnson congratulated ANU on their 1st year Anniversary of Africa Prays, affirming that it is well with Africa with our prayers. Pastor Rudy Depass read from [Mark 4: 22 - 29](#). He compared ANU to a seed that would grow and blossom to glorify God.
