- Conference on sustaining the benefit of ICT boom in Africa, Amsterdam, Netherlands. (01/16)
- 5. Continue to pray for the cure and eradication of HIV/AIDS, TB, Polio, Ebola and other diseases in Africa and other parts of the world.
- 6. Continue to pray for all developmental and <u>African Diaspora Organizations</u> that God will open doors, grant them favor and make resources available to accomplish their various visions for the development of Africa.
- 7. For our families; economic/cultural change that will allow more women to become productive and proactive in the development of Pan-African Countries.
- 8. For permanent peace to take hold and continue to reign in the land.
