Sister Seun Holmes directed a powerful time of prayer, first giving thanks to God for a successful 1st Africa Prays Annual Praise & Worship Concert; as well as sustaining peace in Kenya, Uganda, Ivory Coast & Congo and for Nelson Mandela's upcoming 90th birthday on July 18th. She gave out the prayer points to a selected few present to lead each one up for supplication. Afterwards, she called the children to form a circle and the adults another circle around the children, holding hands, and we all prayed as led by the holy spirit concerning Africa. The following were some of the prayer points for June:

3. For peaceful presidential run-off elections in Zimbabwe and more.
4. For a change in the heart of the people against greed in all ways, that they would repent, humble themselves and be persistent in seeking after the heart and will of God.
5. Continue to pray for success in planning, development and implementation of policies, programs and events geared towards the spiritual & physical development of Africa.

6. For all developmental and African Diaspora Organizations that God will open doors, grant them favor and make resources available to accomplish their various visions for the development of Africa.
7. For our Families

8. For permanent peace to take hold and reign in the land.
