A potent message on **FORGIVENESS** was given by Pastor Brian Seaton, an associate Pastor at HCC, who thanked God for the ANU vision for Africa, a different and new way forward for Africa.  - World - Afghanistan; Iraq; Pakistan-comfort for monsoon rain flood victims; Peace in Asia Korea Peninsulas n end to Mexico drug war; Peace of Jerusalem.
 - Thank God for all co-laborers - missionaries as we implement all Africa Ask Projects across Africa and utterance and favor concerning The Redeemer Man Plan - MIDA Project.
