Sister Seun Holmes, encouraged all present to continue to pray and believe that our Lord is doing create and mighty things in Africa. Sister Paulette Mpouma, began the prayer session by offering up thanksgiving to God for sustaining peace in Haiti, Kenya, Uganda, Ivory Coast, Zimbabwe and Chad, for the protection, grace and favor for President Barack Obama, and the outbreak of peace and tranquility in Congo DRC.
